* A phone call also collocates with take: to take a phone call (to receive a call).

* A promise also collocates with take: to take someone's promise (to accept at their word that they will keep their promise).

* An effort also collocates with take: if something takes effort it is difficult to do.

* A break also collocates with have and make: to make a break (to try to escape), to have a break (to rest from work or to be lucky).

* A chance also collocates with have: to have a chance (to have some possibility of success).

* A look also collocates with have: to have a look at something (to look at it with a purpose).

* A nap also collocates with have: to have a nap.

* A rest also collocates with have: to have a rest.

* A shower/bath also collocates with have and make: to have a shower/bath, to make a bath (to prepare a bath).

* Notes also collocates with make: to make notes.

TO HAVE:

* A baby also collocates with make: to make a baby.
